Please Help your Child with Times Tables

Supporting your child to be fluent with their times tables knowledge is one of the most important things you can do to help your child with numeracy. Knowing your times tables helps build number sense and is critical for multiplication, division, fractions, decimals and percentage calculations and problem solving. Here are some tips and links to help you with this.

You can do simple things like count up in 4s as you climb a set of stairs and count back down in 4s when you descend. Your child should start with reciting times tables, counting up and down and should progress towards finding individual facts e.g. $4\times7=28$ without having to count up. If they are stuck, they should think of a strategy such as 2×7 is 14 so 4×7 will be double that. They should know not only $4\times7=28$ but also $7\times4=28$ and 28/7=4 and 28/4=7.

Some Reminders!

Health Guidance

If your child experiences a bout of sickness or has an upset tummy, please follow NHS Borders health protection advice.

'Where a child has shown symptoms of diarrhoea or vomiting, he or she should not return to nursery/school until a **48-hour period** has passed, during which time there has been no diarrhoea or vomiting.'

<u>Please adhere to this advice and keep your child off school until 48 hours after the last episode of sickness</u>, to avoid infection of other children and adults in nursery and school.

Parking - Can you help?

I would ask that anyone who is coming to school by car, to please park with consideration for the safety of the children, consideration for our neighbours as well as for those needing to use the Disabled parking spaces who need the turning point clear to be able to exit the disabled spaces.

Police Scotland contacted the school regarding this, and they will be carrying out occasional spot checks at drop-off time and will speak to any drivers who are parking without due consideration of others.

Please remember, there is **no parking at all** for parents in the front car park outside the school office or in the back car park next to the nursery. These car parks should only be used for school

visitors and for staff who are travelling from a distance and who need to use their car to get to work.

If you have grandparents or child minders dropping off your children at school or nursery and who do not receive school newsletters, please make sure they are aware of these parking requests.
